Chairman George Kolba called the meeting to order at 3:04 PM. A quorum of five (5) Board Members was present. Sign-in sheet was passed for signatures. Fire exits were identified.

Edward Crumb made a motion for the Board to approve the September 12, 2017 Minutes in the form found in the Board folder with the changes shown.

Steve Andrew seconded the motion

Motion carried 5/0/1 (GH)

Ken DelBianco, P.E. provided an update on the Owners' construction projects at the Plant

- Going well
- Contract 2 with Blue Heron cancelling-out remainder of work
- Contract 4 (MCC) done
- Contract 5 in good shape, shotcrete at bottom of backwash tank completed
 - Application of shotcrete to Secant Pile walls has started
 - Concrete work in new Headworks Building has begun
 - Concrete has been poured in the Generator Building
- Digester 3 completed with coating's; filling with water and putting in agitator to protect against freezing
- Digesters 1 and 2 power-washing; stripped off lot of coating that will need to be renewed/replaced
- Digester 3 could be online in the Spring, with Digesters 1 and 2 possibly operational by Summer
- Contract 10 excavated for new Solids Handling Facility
- Flood Wall received an extension on milestone dates (probably will complete structure in January and manholes in May); the west and south portion of the Flood Wall which is included in Contract 5 should be completed by mid-Summer 2018
- Wet drywall was repaired in the new Administration/Maintenance Building
- A tour was held with DEC representatives, who seemed very well pleased
- In response to a question, Mr. DelBianco stated he has not heard from the Town of Vestal Engineer a shut-off valve has been installed in the Town's Bunn Hill trunk sewer; the Town of Vestal needs to install emergency overflow piping (after obtaining a required DEC permit)

(Mr. DelBianco exited the meeting)

Chuck Shager presented the Fiscal Officer's Report:

Mr. Shager reported that the Board/Plant is \$1 to \$1.2 million under budget so far in 2017, mostly in labor and chemicals.

\$118 million has been spent on the Lead Agency's project to-date (since September 2011).

The NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) —has awarded the Owners a \$10 million grant for the Solids Handling Improvements, but EFC will not begin payments under this grant until January. Regarding the 25% NYS matching share for the FEMA grant, Mr. Shager stated that he arranged for NYS Officials to tour the Plant, focusing on the Flood Wall Project. NYS has a shortfall in HUD from the "Superstorm Sandy" storm, which is coming in slowly (from the federal government), but he believes that NYS will pay its share eventually, so that the Owners can repay construction advances from NYS-EFC.

Board Secretary Cuevas noted that SUNY and Kirkwood have paid their Fourth Quarter Estimated Billings (post-October, so these payments are not reflected on Mr. Shager's report).

Mr. Shager noted that the City's Website has a lot of information and pictures regarding the Lead Agency's Projects.

(Board Member Gary Holmes joined the meeting; all Board Members are now present)

Michael Lisson from St. Amour presented an updated draft of the 2016 financial statement; The original audit was timely been sent to DHS and FEMA. None of the changes change the auditor's opinion.

Charles Pearsall – presented the Business Manager's Report:

- The Town of Union has requested change to the 2012 approved flows. George Kolba, Jr. is not in favor of making any changes without more proof
- Edward Crumb reported that the Plant does not know where the water went but neither does the Town of Union; Johnson City has not filed amended report regarding the water it supplies the Town of Union for its Westover Water District
- Alfred Paniccia asked when do final flows become final? Does the Town of Union have backup for this request?
- Alfred Paniccia suggested sending a letter to Town of Union that the Rules and Regulations state it is not acceptable to give credit or make adjustments to the 2012 approved flows

Edward Crumb made a motion for the Board to accept and approve the low bid submitted by Univar USA of PA for High Calcium Hydrated Lime of \$0.1218/pound and award the supply contract to same for a one-year period beginning December 1, 2017, to be paid from the Chemical line in the budget (J8130.53150).

SUGGESTED TITLE: Accepting FEMA settlements relating to 4031-PW2504v1 in the amount of \$1,063,416.75 and 4031-PW2550 in amount of \$684,165.38 and increasing 2017 Budget appropriations to allow payment of \$1,615,871.43 to the Owners.

PURPOSE OF LEGISLATION: The Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Board requests that the 2017 Budget be increased to allow the receipt of a FEMA payment and subsequent payment to Owners for corrective work to be performed by the Owner's Lead Agency.

SUGGESTED CONTENT: The Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Board received a FEMA check #05897022 for 4031-PW2504v1 in the amount of \$1,063,416.75 and check #05859968 for 4031-PW2550 in amount of \$684,165.38 and requests legislation increasing 2017 Budget revenue appropriations and to allow payment of \$1,615,871.43 to the Owners. On the revenue side: Federal Aid – Emergency (J.44960) should be increased by \$1,481,727.94, State Aid – Emergency (J.43960) and that JF.45031 (Flood Fund - Interfund Transfer) be credited/increased by \$131,710.70. On the expense apportionments that Reimburse Owners for Rec (J8130.54899) be increased by \$1,615,871.43, that Transfer to Capital (J9950.59000) be increased by \$131,710.70 and Flood Capital Fund – Professional Services (JF8130.559105) be increased by \$131,710.70. Payments made via claim to the City of Binghamton (54.8%) in the amount of \$885,497.54 and the Village of Johnson City (45.2%) of \$730,373.89 will then be processed.

Jason Greene, P.E. presented GHD's update on the Industrial Wastewater Pretreatment Program, a copy of which was included in Board Members' folders. A discussion was held regarding Local Limits. Further coordination and discussion is required at a future meeting with the Superintendent present. Mr. Greene noted that the Board would need to issue/advertise proper notice and hold a hearing in order to adopt the fine structure that was previously proposed. Craig Matias reported that there has been a periodic/cyclical "spike" in pH on weekends from the Binghamton Flow Side, jumping from around 7 to 9 on Saturdays beginning around 4:00pm, and returning to around 7 by around 7:30pm. Further investigation/monitoring is warranted.

Operations Summary, Construction and Related Issues

We continue to operate with challenges related to the capacity of the new temporary chlorine contact chamber and the temporary effluent discharge pipe. The discharge pipe was adjusted due to flow constriction at over 24-26 MGD.

At times, during wet weather events, weirs and skimmers in the settling tanks were submerged. GHD and Jacobs are working to resolve the issue.

• On October 15th our flows peaked again, this time at 35 MGD with 0.44 inches of rain. On October 23th we again had problems with weirs under water.

Operations Summary, Construction and Related Issues-cont.

- Bypass pumping of the Binghamton flow commenced October 26. The flows from the bypass pumping scheme are extremely erratic, with changes of 6-10 MGD flow within minutes. This problem has not yet been resolved. Operations will continue to adjust Binghamton header valves to settling tanks 2 thru 5 dues to erratic flow and wet weather flows On October 25th NYSEG drilled into the Terminal Pump Station force main, causing a leak and requiring shutdown and repair. DEC was on site to observe.
- The solids handling phase of the construction has begun.
- Flood Wall: Vestal 12" line Overflow is required. There have been Planning/ Discussion meetings with the Town Engineer, and the issue is not yet resolved
- Request Authorization for travel, advance of \$300.00 and reimbursement of any related expenses for Facility Engineer to attend the Basic Lab Course December 4th thru 8th.

Edward Crumb made a motion for the Board to approve a travel allowance of up to \$300.00 and related expenses for attendance at the Basic Laboratory Course by the Facility Engineer in accordance with the Board's Travel Policy.
